ITS HEARTLAND 2018 ANNUAL MEETING



Students are invited to present their current ITS research (or any desired ITS topic) at a poster session on Tuesday, April 24, 2018. The ITS Heartland Awards Committee will determine winners based on the criteria below. A stipend of \$125 will be provided each student competition participant to offset travel costs. Students are also invited to participate in the conference and will not be charged an admission fee.

Three students will be chosen as winners of the ITS Heartland Student Competition and will receive the following:

- First Place: \$800
- Second Place: \$400
- Third Place: \$250

Project Evaluation Criteria

Projects will be evaluated considering the following criteria:

- Poster presentation of information in an easy to understand, yet engaging format;
- Interest of the topic and content to the broad Intelligent Transportation Systems industry;
- Analysis and reasoning;
- Timeliness, originality, and creativity;
- Quality and use of research;
- Depth of knowledge, and awareness of ITS issues and challenges.

Eligibility Requirements

- Author must be a full-time student enrolled in an accredited institution of learning in the ITS Heartland region.
- Entries are limited to one poster per student.

- Author contact information (name, school, phone number, email address)
- Abstract Text (500 word maximum)
