On February 26th, ITS Heartland lost one of its most devoted and influential members. Please take a moment to remember Barb Blue, President of ITS Heartland from 2012 to 2013, and employee of the Kansas Department of Transportation.

Barb joined KDOT as a full time employee in 2001 as the ATIS coordinator and 511 program manager. She was instrumental in creating the 511 telephone traveler information system in Kansas. During her tenure with KDOT, Barb served on the National Committee for Traveler Information and was a Board Member and Past President of ITS Heartland. Barb became a recognized authority on traveler information/511 systems and was often contacted by other states for assistance. At the time of her passing, Barb was in a new position at KDOT, involved in multiple projects, respected for her excellent project management skills and as always, impressive in her ability to make things happen one way or another. Barb was a constant presence at ITS Heartland annual meetings. She will be missed.




