## Summary and Email from Alex Wassman regarding MCOMP

ITSH Board,

Here is an update on the MCOMP project for those who were unable to attend the call, as well as scopes and fee options for the administration contract. Negotiations on the contract are close to concluding. One of the proposers has requested a debrief about why they were not chosen, which will take place the second week of January. The proposer chosen to do the work is ETALYC, a startup consisting of a group of Iowa State professors. Microsoft is also listed to assist with some of the web services. A regional Microsoft branch also put in their own proposal, and the final proposal was from Excel Global Solutions.

Olsson submitted documents and recommendations on their administration of the MCOMP project, which are attached. See below for their comments and a recommendation to use a wait-and-see approach since we have enough money to operate for a while without risk. If we choose to spend the available budget until it runs out, the project would need to be managed by the member agencies through completion. Until the contract begins it is difficult to estimate the amount of time and effort this would take.

"Here are the scope and fee estimates as requested. There are 2 sets of each document – one to meet the available \$50,000 budget, the other to do the management properly, which comes to about \$75,000.

The full version is based on the premise that it will take more effort to manage during year 1, since we'll be setting expectations and processes for the first time – then it will simply be a matter of keeping tabs on things and making sure things go well thereafter. So we estimated about \$25,500 for year 1, and \$16,500 per year thereafter, totaling \$75,000 for all 4 years.

For the partial version, we went back and forth on how to show this – whether to reduce the hours per year, or to reduce the total number of years. We ended up showing a reduced number of hours per year. The PDF documents show the number of hours associated with each scenario. Feel free to share these with the board if you would like.

The two scope documents are the same, with the exception of the one "General Assumptions" section at the bottom of the "partial" document, which basically says that we will work until the money runs out.

You'll note that we have Mike Jackson taking the lion's share of managing the contractor, where Kyle and I are pulled in minimally from a project management and technical expertise standpoint. This was strategic in that Mike has experience managing Anuj's work already from his time at lowa DOT, and he is there in Ames with them – so it seemed to make sense.

On the Full vs. Partial approach – my thoughts are that it really is an estimate at this point on how much effort it will take to manage them in the long run. It could very well be that they get into a great groove and do good things and take very little oversight to get it done. In that case, we should be able to make

the management dollars stretch. On the other hand, if they are like a lot of researchers and creative types and require more consistent oversight, then it could be tougher. But, I think we should have a very good feel for that after a year and a half. So I think If I were you, I'd go with the option that you already have money for, then regroup after a year into the operations to see how you want to proceed at that point.
