Mobility on Demand Alliance Forum Recap By Kurt Rotering

Mobility on Demand (MOD) is a vision for an integrated network of safe, carefree, and reliable transportation options that are available to all. In today's rapidly changing and growing transportation landscape, cities, DOTs, transit agencies, mobility and micro-mobility providers like TNCs, scooter companies, data companies, financial and insurance services and many others are focused on how to deliver customer-focused, seamless mobility. But it takes work. And working together.

On February 27th, 2020, ITS Heartland and ITS America's Mobility on Demand Alliance (MODA) hosted the inaugural MOD Forum, where 50 transportation professionals, policy makers, and advocates discussed successes and addressed some key issues facing MOD's rapid transformation of how we move were tackled. Amy Ford of ITS America and MODO engaged the attendees and panelists to have robust discussions about:

• Framing the Building Blocks of MOD

• What is MOD? How does it differ from urban to suburban? Is there rural MOD? Do we consider tolling, congestion pricing, connected vehicle technologies, freight and cargo movement, operations, and asset management as part of MOD?

• Examine the MOD Opportunities in Kansas City Metro

- How do we create scale and replicability for MOD? What conditions need to be in place to move past pilots to create seamless mobility?
- Does the public need to know about Mobility on Demand? Should they care or do they just need to experience it? How should we educate the public and who should do it – the public or the private sector?

Enable MOD: The Public and Private Sector Perspective

- What is the cultural shift in public agencies and private companies necessary to increase awareness of and enable the scale and replicability of MOD?
- What do we need to understand about each other to make MOD work?
- If part of MOD is private sector mobility services, how do we create a system that not just improves the safety, accessibility, and ease of travel in our communities but also supports a robust private marketplace?

Thank you to everyone that attended and participated in our inaugural MOD Forum in Kansas City. Especially thank you to Amy Ford and the rest of the ITS America who helped facilitate and put this forum together. Also thank you to Lindsay Francis, WSP, for helping plan and coordinate the location. And thank you to CUBIC for sponsoring and attending!

ITS Heartland is planning on hosting three more forums in the upcoming year in Wichita, Lincoln, and Des Moines. The exact dates of these forums are still in flux and will be announced in the future, but I encourage you to try to attend one of them.
